## Read what your State Senate Candidates say about the East Boston Substation and 115,000 volt power lines.

**Dan Rizzo:** *“Exposing residents of Eagle Hill to strong 115,000 volt power lines on top of the issues we're currently trying to mitigate makes no sense. As your Senator, I would work to establish an alternate location with NSTAR/EverSource.”*

I would work with all stakeholders to prevent any expansion that is unsafe or dangerous. I would join my colleague Rep Adrian Madaro in asking questions as part of the regulatory process currently underway to safeguard the community.”*

**Joseph Boncore:** *“I have reviewed the letter forwarded to the Energy Facilities Siting Board written by Representative Adrian Madaro and City Councilor Sal LaMattina. I stand with them and share in each of their concerns raised on behalf of the community.”*
